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CHARACTERS

DR. MICHAEL KRAMER, 30's-100's

SETTING

An auditorium in Ohio

TIME

The near future

A presentation. A man at a podium controls a Powerpoint. He wears a lab coat. The screen has a slide that says, "Welcome."

DR. KRAMER

Ladies and gentlemen. I understand that you thought you would be seeing a boring presentation about the world of Palynology. But! Instead, you will be seeing an exciting presentation about the world of Palynology! As you know, we here at the Allergy Center Headquarters of Ohio, known as A-C-H-O-O, have been tirelessly working toward the elimination of allergies for good. Hayfever, ragweed, kids unable to eat ice cream because of milk allergies, kids unable to eat Mounds because of the nuts. Or are Mounds the ones that don't have nuts? No matter. At first, we were simply treating allergens with pills.

Slide of pills.

DR. KRAMER

Who likes taking pills? Who can remember to take pills? I'm on an anti-psychotic and I forget to take that all the time!

Slide of a syringe.

DR. KRAMER

Or shots. Who likes getting shots? Oddly enough, I do, but I realize I'm in the minority. We thought about how to get to the source of allergies.

Slide of plants.

DR. KRAMER

We started with plants. These bastards are taking over the world! Encroaching into our territory. Some people even bring them in their homes! Just kidding. We're not at war with plants. It's not practical. And they'd win. Trust me. They're ruthless.

Slide of a nose.

DR. KRAMER

So, we started to investigate the nose.

Slide of throat.

DR. KRAMER

The throat.

Slide of lungs.

DR. KRAMER

The lungs. These make up all the pieces that react to most allergens. So, we have--

Slide of Bob, a normal looking guy with five o'clock shadow.

DR. KRAMER

Bob. Can we bring out Bob please?

Two men in lab coats carry in Bob in plain clothes. Bob stares, unblinking.

DR. KRAMER

This is Bob. Our 2 and a half million dollar man. Bob's sinuses, nose, lungs, and trachea were replaced with a series of robotics. The upside? Bob shows absolutely no signs of seasonal allergies! He is allergy free! The downside? Bob is dead. Thank you, gentlemen.

The men cart away Bob.

DR. KRAMER

But even with the loss of Bob, we knew that robotics was the way to go. While replacing organs seemed like a good idea, it really didn't get to the heart of the problem. You see, it only affected airborne allergens. What about those that we eat? What about those that we touch? The key is this--

A blank, white slide.

DR. KRAMER

You can't see it, but there's a robot, or nanobot there. He's microscopic. I have a better picture here.

Slide of a tiny black dot.

DR. KRAMER

Our camera didn't get a good photo. The iPhone isn't perfect for microscopic snapshots. But we all love this picture of Archie, that's the code name. You know, because it is orange colored, as you can see from the photo. Like Archie? The comic book character? Betty and Veronica? You may ask, what does Archie do?

Slide of a question mark.

DR. KRAMER

What causes allergic reactions?

Slide of a white blood cell.

DR. KRAMER

Our immune systems. Our immune systems cause them. If you're allergic to something, your immune system, your white blood cells, are actually going rogue and trying to eliminate the allergen and you along with it. It's the biological nuclear option. These are the bastards that must be stopped. That's where Archie comes in.

Slide of a black dot next to a silhouette of a person.

DR. KRAMER

Archie, well, thousands, if not millions of Archies get into the host body and immediately kill all your white blood cells. Then, the Archies all assume the place of these blood cells, becoming a super-powered immune system, removing all immune system issues, including allergies, forever! You may ask, "Doctor Creighton, how do I get the Archies in my body?" And I would say, "First off, my name is Doctor Kramer. Second, you get the Archies into your body by inhalation." I'll demonstrate.

He takes a squirt bottle, one that looks a bit like it used to hold Febreze or something and walks toward the audience. He steps off the stage and starts spraying up into the air above people in the first row.

DR. KRAMER

Congratulations, you are all now allergy free.

He goes back to the stage.

DR. KRAMER
